Someone's in the Kitchen

Mom's Buttermilk Peach Cobbler in Cast Iron Skillet

Heat oven to 350 degrees.

Melt in a cast iron skillet:
1 stick butter (1/2 cup)

Combine in a small bowl:
1 cup sugar
1 cup flour
1/2 teaspoon baking soda
1/4 teaspoon salt

Add to mixture:
1 cup buttermilk

Pour mixture into the melted butter and stir briefly to distribute butter through batter.

Pour onto top of batter:
2-3 cups sliced sweetened peaches
1 cup peach juice

Sprinkle top with:
1/3 cup sugar

Bake at 350 degrees for 40-50 minutes until browned

Oh Boy Waffles

Recipe makes five 7-8" Belgian waffles

A good recipe I used when our boys were young that doesn't require making ahead of time or beating the egg whites separately.

Combine in a medium bowl:
2 1/4 cups flour
4 teaspoons baking powder
3/4 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 Tablespoons sugar

Combine in a small bowl:
2 beaten eggs
3/4 cup oil
2 1/4 cups milk

Add the liquid ingredients to the dry ingredients and stir just till combined (leave some lumps).
Heat waffle maker till ready. Pour batter into waffle maker and cook until browned.

Grandma's Scotch Squares

2/3 cup shortening
1 box brown sugar
3 eggs
2 3/4 cups plain flour
1 tsp salt
2 1/2 tsp baking powder
1 cup chopped nuts

Warm shortening. Add sugar and stir. When cooled, add eggs, flour, etc. Beat well and add nuts. (I have used pecans and peanuts but you can use whatever nut you prefer.) Press thick dough into a greased and floured pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 20-25 minutes. Cool and cut into squares for serving.
